



Since the January 2010 earthquake, the Clinton Foundation has been turning the donations of money and supplies made by individuals and organizations into direct assistance for the people and government of Haiti. More than 100,000 individuals and organizations have donated more than \$16 million to the Clinton Foundation Haiti Fund.

To date, the Clinton Foundation has:

- Issued \$3 million in emergency relief grants to 12 organizations
- Incurred over \$1.4 million in shipping costs to deliver over \$16 million of emergency relief supplies
- Allocated \$1 million for communal hurricane emergency shelters
- Contributed \$1 million for operational support to the Interim Haiti Recovery Commission (IHRC)
- Allocated over \$800,000 for the purchase of portable latrines
- Purchased and delivered \$300,000 in non-genetically modified seeds for the Ministry of Agriculture
- Purchased and delivered 2,500 tents valued at \$345,000
- Provided thousands of hours of pro bono staffing, administration, and fundraising support for all Haiti relief efforts, including the Clinton Bush Haiti Fund and recent efforts to support the launch of the IHRC

In collaboration with various private- and public-sector entities, the Clinton Foundation has delivered:

- Units to produce water for up to 10,000 people per day
- Over 34,000 tents to people who lost their homes in the earthquake
- Over 24 tons of medical supplies to hospitals and clinics
- 141 trucks to facilitate the transportation and delivery of supplies within Haiti
- 58 solar street lights to increase public safety
- 14 pieces of heavy machinery to assist in the rebuilding efforts
- 4 portable classrooms, which were equipped with furniture and school supplies
