The Clinton Global Initiative University (CGI U) is the higher education program of the Clinton Foundation that supports undergraduate and graduate students across the world who **commit to take action** to address pressing global challenges of the 21st century.





Who is eligible for CGI U?

institution of higher education, undergraduate or


graduate, at the time of application are eligible to apply.

What is a Commitment to Action?

Through CGI U, students are asked to make a new, specific, and measurable human-centered commitment that addresses a pressing challenge. So what are we looking for?



New

Commitment addresses an unmet need or aims to solve a well-known problem in a new and unique way.



Specific

Commitment should have a defined course of action, detailed objectives, and a realistic timeline.



Measurable

Commitment should make an impact in ways that are measurable and can be reported.



Examples of impactful commitments







Lucky Iron Fish

Commitment to produce a cooking tool that infuses meals with iron to help prevent and treat iron deficiency.

Agro360

Commitment to use artificial intelligence that analyzes the condition of crops to improve agricultural productivity.


Commitment to increase access to STEM education and experiential learning through scholarships.

Focus Area: Education



How do you design a Commitment to Action that is new, specific, and measurable and impactful?







The social entrepreneur's working agreement:

- Asking the right questions is more important than having the right answers
- Do not make assumptions
- Be committed to the problem, not the solution
- Do not be afraid to ask for help
- We are better when we work together
- Diverse teams = more innovative problem-solving







The Problem (Approach: Research)

- What is the problem?
- Why is it a problem?
- Who is negatively impacted by this problem?
- Where does this problem exist?
- Why does this problem originally exist?
- Why does this problem still exist?
- Who else is trying to address this problem?
- Has this problem been successfully addressed elsewhere?







- What is my connection to this problem?
- Why do I care about addressing this problem?
- What makes me qualified to address this problem?
- What value do I bring to addressing this problem?

The Community (Approach: Conversations)

- What groups of people should I speak with about this problem?
- Whose lives will be positively impacted by addressing this problem?
- How will lives be positively impacted by addressing this problem?
- How will I engage with people in the community and with community partners in addressing this problem?









In the UK, men outnumber women 3-to-1 in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) professions (78% compared to 22%).

In a recent study through the Geena Davis Institute for Gender in Media, it was determined that male STEM characters outnumber female STEM characters 2-to-1 in UK media.

As someone who works in media, you want to improve these statistics and see more diverse representation in STEM fields.

How should you approach this problem?




